

**Remember that the God to whom we pray is *Jehovah-raphé*.
He is the Lord who heals.**

Pray simply. When Moses prayed for his sister Miriam, he said, “*O God, please heal her.*” She was healed. (from Numbers 12:1-5)

Pray confidently. “*Heal her, O Lord, and she will be healed, save her and she will be saved, for You are the one we praise.*”
(from Jeremiah 17:9,14)

Pray with faith. A sick woman wanted healing, so she touched Jesus. He answered her silent plea, “*Your faith has healed you.*”
(from Mark 5:25-34)

Pray with thankfulness. One leper, *when he saw he was healed, came back, praising God with a loud voice. He threw himself at Jesus’ feet and thanked him.*
(Luke 17:15)

Pray for God to be glorified. When the blind man was healed, someone asked Jesus, “*Who sinned that this man was born blind?*” Jesus said, “*Neither he nor his parents sinned. This happened so the work of God might be displayed in his life.*”
(from John 9:1-3)

Pray for God’s will to be done. “*If we ask anything according to his will he hears us* (1 John 5:14).

Remember to pray for the heart, soul, and mind of those who are sick.

Pray that they would know God’s love. *Nothing will be able to separate us from the love of God in Christ Jesus our Lord.*
(Romans 8:39)

Pray that they would believe that *for those who love God all things work together for good.* (Romans 8:28)

Pray that they would be comforted. *God is the Father of mercies and the God of all comfort, who comforts us in our affliction.* (2 Corinthians 1:3-4)

Pray that they would think about *whatever is true, noble, right, pure, lovely, admirable, excellent and praiseworthy.* (from Philippians 4:8)
